TREA was established in 1992, and we continue to grow in order to provide expanded opportunities for our membership. TREA exists to support and collaborate with school districts in their goal of improving student achievement by providing a variety of services and benefits. Please make sure you are aware of all of the benefits available to your District. Below are the benefits of being a member. You can also review them on our website.

Job Board | Our <u>Job Board</u> offers 10 free postings for TREA member districts, has listings for any and all school district openings and positions as well as positions available with our current corporate sponsors. Non-member districts are able to view and respond to postings at no charge and may post for a nominal fee.

Student Scholarships & Art Contest | TREA and our sponsors award more than \$50,000 in scholarships annually. Applications for these <u>scholarships</u> are available in December to every graduating senior attending a TREA member district. We also sponsor an <u>Art Contest</u> which awards close to \$3000 between 9 winners across three multi grade level divisions. Applications will be available in the Spring.

Robotics Education Competition Foundation (REC) Grants | In 2021 REC partnered with TREA and so far has awarded over \$70,000 in high school robotics kits and entry fees to TREA member districts. There is an opportunity for more participants this year. High School grants include the robotics kit, training, and limited entry fees, valued at \$2,000. No Kid Hungry Texas (NKH) Grants | In addition to being a TREA Diamond Sponsor, NKH awarded \$150,000 to five TREA member districts in 2021-22, Cotulla, Mexia, Mount Pleasant, Navasota, and Sinton. For 2022-23, NKH will award \$30,000 to each of these rural school districts, Bland, Brookesmith, Henderson, Junction, Slaton, and Smithville.

TREA Summer Conference | TREA offers a <u>Summer Conference</u> at the end of June each year and 2022 was the largest ever. There were over 500 registrants, numerous breakout sessions, many of which were for Board Training credits and an exhibit expo with 60 vendors and sponsors. Advocacy | TREA represents our membership at both the state and national level. We have a Legislative Committee, and work with Powell Law Group (PLG) on legislative matters. During the legislative session members receive weekly legislative updates through PLG and TREA. TREA member districts are also represented by The National Rural Education Association (NREA). Currently 44 states are members of NREA. The National Rural Education Advocacy Coalition (NREAC) is the legislative branch of NREA.

Legal Services Program | At no additional cost, TREA members are entitled to a basic retainership through the Powell Law Group (PLG). The retainership also includes some board training opportunities and other services which can be found here.

Superintendent Mentor Program | New superintendents must have a trained superintendent mentor who oversees 36 hours of professional development and maintains correspondence on a regular basis.
