#### More Students Have Access to Free School Breakfast!

School breakfast provides the consistent nutrition kids need to learn, grow and reach their fullest potential. No Kid Hungry Texas is proud to announce that thanks to the 88th Texas Legislature, new investments in school meals are expanding access to free school breakfast for eligible students. Starting September 1, 2023, students who are eligible for reduced priced meals at school will receive school breakfast free for the next two school years (2023-2024 and 2024-2025).

Texas had a team in the finals from The Rural Schools Innovation Zone (RSIZ) which is made up of TREA member district Freer ISD, Brooks County ISD and Premont ISD. All five finalist teams traveled to Washington to present their technology education programs at the White House. For this showcase event, the Rural Tech Project convened the challenge judges and education leaders to hear the teams' presentations. 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The SMART (Surface Magnetic Assessment in Real-Time) Project invites schools nationwide to participate in network magnetic field observations during upcoming solar eclipses in October 2023 and April 2024.

SMART is a National Science Foundation-sponsored science and engineering project headquartered at UCLA that builds and operates a network of ground-based magnetometers in the United States for space weather observations. The project comprises groups in hardware, software, observatory operation, space weather science, big data, and education, continuing the heritage of UCLA as a national leader in related areas.

With the upcoming solar eclipses in the continental United States, we would like to set up small and easy-to-operate magnetometer devices at more than 50 locations to investigate how solar eclipses can affect the electric current system in the geospace.

If we partner with a school, the school will set up and operate the device over three days to ensure proper data collection during the solar eclipse event. Our team will send a kit and operating instructions and aid in troubleshooting or provide any other assistance the school may need.
